Lesson #6 – Creation, Lenten Chain

The Creation Story: (click here for a post about creation puzzles)

(I put the creation puzzles on magnetic sheets and used a magnetic white board to put the puzzle pieces on as I told the story of creation.)

Today I want to tell you a story that comes from the Bible. It is from the very beginning of the Bible.

- (Put up the #1 puzzle half.)
 - A very long time ago, there was only God. There were no people. There were no animals. There was no sun or stars or moon. There were no flowers or trees.
 - A very long time ago, God said, "Let there be light!"
 - Say it with me: "LET THERE BE LIGHT!"
 - And there was light.
 - (Put up the other half of the #1 puzzle.)
 - God said, "That's good! That's very good!"
 - Say it with me. "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"
 - What is after the #1? (2)
- (Put up the #2 puzzle half.)
 - On the second day hold up two fingers –
 - What do you think God made? (sky and water)
 - God spoke and the sky separated from the waters.
 - (Put up the other half of the #2 puzzle.)
 - God said, "That's good! That's very good!"
 - Say it with me. "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"
 - What is after the #2? (3)
- (Put up the #3 puzzle half.)
 - On the third day hold up 3 fingers
 - What do you think God made? God made the flowers and the trees!
 - (Put up the other half of the #3 puzzle.)
 - After making all the flowers and trees, God said, "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"
 - What is after the #3? (4)
- (Put up the #4 puzzle half.)
 - On the fourth day hold up 4 fingers
 - What do you think God made? God made stars, planets, moon, and the sun!
 - (Put up the other half of the #4 puzzle.)
 - God said, "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"
 - What is after the #4? (5)

- (Put up the #5 puzzle half.)
 - On the fifth day hold up 5 fingers
 - What do you think God made? God made the birds and the fish.
 - (Put up the other half of the #1 puzzle.)
 - God said, "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"
 - What is after the #5? (6)
- (Put up the #6 puzzle half.)
 - On the sixth day hold up 6 fingers
 - What do you think God made? God made the animals.
 - What are some of the animals that God made?
 - God also made people.
 - God used mud to make a man.
 - God then breathed His Spirt into the man.
 - (Put up the other half of the #6 puzzle.)
 - God said, "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"
 - What is after the #6? (7)
- (Put up the #7 puzzle half.)
 - On the seventh day hold up 7 fingers
 - What do you think God made?
 - God didn't make anything. God rested.
 - What day of the week are we to rest like God did? (Sunday)
 - Sunday is our day of rest. What do you think we should do on Sundays? (rest, go to church, spend time with family – eating, playing)
 - (Put up the other half of the #7 puzzle.)
 - God created the world and everything that is in it.
 - What did God say? "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"
- God created each of you.
 - What do you think God said after he created you?
 - "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"

Creation Game: (click here for a post about the creation game)

Hand out game boards (have these ready to be used).

Children color the pictures of things created each day of creation.

Children play the game with their parents:

- Roll a die.
- Turn up the flap with the number rolled.
- Say what was created that day.
- Say what God said: "THAT'S GOOD! THAT'S VERY GOOD!"
- Leave the flap up.
- Roll the die again.
- When you have 6 flaps up, put up the last flap.
- Tell what God did on the 7th day. (He rested!)

New Items:

(Look at the bottom of this post for the pdf of the large pictures used in this lesson.)

Put a large picture of these items in a gift bag. Take out the pictures one at a time. Ask the children the name of the item.

- Processional crucifix:
 - o bring the crucifix to the social hall or take the children to look at it
 - When is the processional crucifix carried at Mass?
 - Opening Procession (show picture)
 - Closing procession (show picture)
 - This month watch for the two times the processional crucifix is carried at Mass.

If possible, go to the Church and see the (if not, show pictures):

- Crucifix
- Presider's Chair: where the priest sits
- Cathedra and Bishop: (Our parish church is the Cathedral for our diocese. If you are not at a Cathedral, you may want to skip this part.)
 - Whose chair do you think this is? (The bishop's chair)
 - Show a picture of the bishop.
 - A priest leads a parish.
 - Our bishop leads our diocese (lots of parishes in this area of the state).
 - Only the bishop sits in the cathedra.
 - Our parish, the Cathedral, is the bishop's church so we have a special chair for the bishop.
 - The other churches in our diocese do not have a special chair for the bishop.

Creation Puzzles: (click here for a post about creation puzzles)

Each child gets a set of the puzzles and puts them together with his/her parents helping.

Lenten chain: (click here for the website with a Lenten prayer chain to print)

- This Wednesday we begin a new season in the church year. What do you think it is? (Lent)
- What color of vestment does Father wear during Lent? (purple)
- What does Lent prepare us for? (Easter)
- What do we celebrate at Easter? (Jesus' rising from the dead)
- What color of vestments does Father wear during the Easter season? (white)
- Show a sample Lenten chain
- Explain how to use the Lenten chain:
 - Take off one link of the chain each day of Lent
 - Pray the prayer on the link
- Each child makes a Lenten chain with his/her parents.

Pass out Home lessons and pages for Mass books:

Stickers:

Give each child a sticker as they leave.
