# Joyful Catholic Families Lesson #8 – Easter & More on the Mass

# New Items:

(Look at the bottom of this post for the pdf of the large pictures used in this lesson.)

- Preparing the altar: (show picture)
  - The altar servers prepare the altar.
  - What do they put on the altar? (chalice, paten, purificator, Roman Missal)
  - The altar servers also put the corporal on the altar. (show picture)
- Corporal:

(<u>This post</u> has information on making a corporal for the children and how to fold a coporal.)

- The corporal is a cloth that is put on the altar to catch any really tiny pieces of Jesus' Body that might fall.
- Show how to unfold and fold the corporal
- Show how to "empty" the corporal into the chalice (putting any tiny fragments of the consecrated host into the chalice so the corporal can be washed)
- Give the children a corporal made out of paper towels or felt to practice unfolding and folding it.

(Note: Take the corporals back to put in the Mass kits for the next class)

- Washing hands: (show picture)
  - Demonstrate how water is poured over Father's hands by using a cruet, bowl, and towel
  - Why does Father wash his hands?
    - Used to be the offertory gifts might be chickens, eggs, sheep,...so the priest needed to clean his hands.
    - Priest says quietly, "Lord, wash away my iniquity; cleanse me from my sin"
    - The washing of the priest's hands is now a sign of the priest's wish to be purified, to be cleansed of his sins.
  - Wash each child's hands OR children can take turns washing each other's hands.
- Putting the Body of Christ into the tabernacle: (show picture)
  - If there is any of Jesus' Body (the consecrated hosts) left after Communion, they are placed in the tabernacle.
  - Any of Jesus' Blood that is left after Communion is consumed (drank by the priest or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.)
- Purifying (cleaning) the sacred vessels: (show picture)
  - After Communion, Father or a deacon purifies (cleans) the sacred vessels (patens, chalices).

- Explain how they can take these to church and follow where we are at Mass.
- Have the children (with parents helping) find these pages:
  - $\,\circ\,$  Father kissing the altar at the beginning of Mass. (page 2)
  - Children putting money in the basket (page 11)
  - Washing Father's hands (page 14)
  - Father kissing the altar at the end of Mass (page 27)
- Color the covers
- Put names on the covers
- While waiting for other children to finish coloring, the children can look through the Mass booklets with their parents.
- Please bring these booklets with you to our next class.

# Explain to the parents about the next class while the children are coloring the Mass booklets:

- This year we have learned a lot about the Mass: what happens during Mass and items used during Mass.
- We will end our year by playing "Mass"
  - The children will be altar servers.
  - The dads/grandpas will be the priests.
    - They do not have to be Catholic to do this.
    - It is important to our priest and bishop that we show through our play that it is only boys that can someday be priests – so we will only have men be the priests
    - Need a dad or grandpa for every two kids.
  - The moms/grandmas will be "sacristans"
    - Help keep things moving and take pictures.

# Easter Tops: What happened during the Easter season?

- What season of the church year comes before Easter? (Lent show Lent on the liturgical calendar)
- What color of vestment did Father wear during Lent? (purple)
- What color of vestment did Father wear today? (white)
- What season of the church year are we in now? (show the Easter season on the liturgical calendar and which Sunday is today)
- The Easter season is a time of great joy because Jesus rose from the dead.
  - Using the large pictures from the Easter tops, talk about the Easter season.
    - The Resurrection: Jesus rises from the dead
    - An angel tells the women Jesus is risen
    - Jesus is known in the breaking of the bread
    - Jesus appears to Thomas and Thomas believes
    - The Ascension: Jesus ascends into heaven
    - Pentecost: The Holy Spirit is given to the Church
- These tops have pictures from the Easter season on them.
  - Show the kids how to use the tops and then they return to their parents to do this activity:
    - Spin the top.
    - Put a finger on the cardstock and push down to stop the top.
    - Tell something about the picture that your finger is on.
    - Spin the top again and repeat.

# Make Ascension/Pentecost Craft with Blue Cup:

What is it called when Jesus rose up into the sky? (Ascension)

• Show the Ascension by pulling Jesus up into the cup.

Ten days after Jesus' ascension, after Jesus rose up into the sky, the Holy Spirit came down onto the apostles.

• Show Pentecost by swinging down the dove/fire on the string.

Repeat – showing the Ascension and Pentecost again.

Children make their own Ascension/Pentecost cups.

- Note: Put small holes in the bottom of the cups before class.
- Color and cut out "Jesus" and the "dove/fire"
- Tape one end of the string to "Jesus".
- Put the other end of the string through the cup and out the bottom of the cup.
- Tape the "dove/fire" to the end of the string.
- Stretch cotton balls until cloud like.
- Glue to the outside of the cup with glue sticks.

When everyone has their Ascension/Pentecost cups finished:

- Say "Ascension" and the children pull "Jesus" into the cup.
- Say "Pentecost" and the children swing down the "dove/fire"
- Repeat several times.

#### Parachute:

- All the children grab hold of the parachute (or sheet).
- Explain:
  - On the 40<sup>th</sup> day of Easter we celebrate the Ascension -- when Jesus rose into Heaven.
    - When I say the word "Ascension" everyone raises the parachute up.
  - On the 50<sup>th</sup> day of Easter we celebrate Pentecost the birthday of the church – the day the Holy Spirit came down on Mary and the apostles.
    - When I say "Pentecost" everyone pulls the parachute down to the ground.
  - Say "Ascension" and "Pentecost" several times with the children raising and lowering the parachute.
- Put Easter eggs or balls on the parachute.
  - Let's see how long we can keep the eggs/balls on the parachute
  - After a while say, "When I say 'Ascension', let's see how fast you can get the balls off of the parachute." Then say "Ascension!"
  - Children pick up the balls and put them back on the parachute.
  - Repeat.
